

Dear Pastors, Friends, and All of You That Receive this Letter,

I have been burdened about something I've had on my mind for a while! Please bear with me, and judge me after you've read the 'whole' letter. I beg you to do this in light of all that is happening in the World today. To deny that this is a very 'unique' time in History is to ignore 'plain fact & truths', that are right in front of us.

I recently talked with Dr. Paul Fedena about what I'm going to share with you. First let me say that Paul Fedena is one of the most respected "men of God" that many of us know. He has Pastored & Preached close to fifty years. I put a question to him a week or so ago. I said that a great portion of the whole Bible is given over to "prophecy". (Many claim 1/4 to 1/3 of the Bible is dedicated to prophetic & future events) I then ask him, in light of that, "why don't most fundamental preachers preach on it?" He told me that he was 'befuddled' too, as to why it seems to be a much ignored subject. When I was pastoring, I remember having him and other men come, and hold "Prophecy Conferences"! Over the years, and different churches I was in, these were always some of the 'best attended' services we ever had!

Unique among all books ever written, the Bible accurately foretells specific events-in detail-many years, sometimes centuries, before they occur. Approximately **2500** prophecies appear in the pages of the Bible, **about 2000** of which already have been fulfilled to the letter—no errors. (The remaining 500 or so reach into the future and may be seen unfolding as days go by.) Many of us in our lifetimes have already seen some pretty 'big' prophecies fulfilled! (*i.e. Israel becoming a Nation in 1948; The European Union and how their wanting to divide the World into 5 regions with 10 Leaders; Jerusalem becoming a "burdensome stone"! etc.*) Since the probability for any one of these prophecies having been fulfilled by chance averages less than one in ten (figured very conservatively) and since the prophecies are for the most part independent of one another, the odds for all these prophecies having been fulfilled by chance without error is less than one in 10^{2000} (that is 1 with 2000 zeros written after it)! **Folks do you realize that we have a Book that has proven itself 100% accurate on Its prophecies!**

This is an astounding record of "Biblical" fulfillment, which cannot be denied. Let's face it; the evidence of God's Divine Truth is too overwhelming to **NOT PREACH ON IT!** Fulfilled prophecy is one of the most powerful proofs that the Bible truly is the Word of God. Since all of the prophecies that should have been fulfilled in the first coming of Christ were fulfilled to the finest detail, we can be sure that the Bible itself is God's revelation to man since no human writer could be 100% accurate.

Now, having said that, let me suggest to Preachers & Churches, which love the Lord and His Soon Coming, to embrace this important Doctrine! ([2 Timothy 4:8](#)) This Teaching can be some of the most encouraging words to get Christians back to effective evangelism. ([2 Peter 3:9](#)) It can stir up the Body of Christ to live godly lives. ([Titus 2:11-13](#); [1 John 3:1-3](#) - Note [v. 3](#)) It can bring life back into our "lifeless" Churches, which are focusing on building the 'Kingdom' down here! We should be like Abraham of old, "*For he looked for a city which hath foundations, whose builder and maker is God.*" His focus was on God, and a promised future Kingdom, that God would build! Remember what John said about the Book of Revelation, in verse 3...

[Rev 1:3](#) Blessed is he that readeth, and they that hear the words of this prophecy, and keep those things which are written therein: for the time is at hand.

Our Bible-believing churches have gotten away from prophecy for one reason or another. Some think it's too sensational, and will turn off serious students of the Bible. My answer to that is, "*the entire Bible is sensational*", especially prophecy! ([2 Pet. 3:10-12](#)) Others say that it's not what the people want or need! Look, anything that takes up a fourth to one third of the Bible, must be "exactly" what our people need,

and should want! One preacher told me that it's too confusing, and doesn't build and strengthen God's people in the faith. I strongly disagree with that statement, because it just isn't true. Think of all the things you can hit on, in light of Christ's Coming! Things like - "soul winning", "godly living", "sin", "not loving the world", "becoming more like Jesus", "being prepared for the Judgment Seat of Christ", etc.; The second coming of Christ gives us a 'plethora' of Bible subjects to deal with! Amen?

I would also like to suggest that you have a "Prophecy Conference" in 2010. Do not pass by the opportunity to fire your people up, about the Coming of Christ! Bring in a knowledgeable preacher on "[eschatological](#) doctrine". Might I suggest having Dr. Paul Fedena in, for a "prophetic conference"? He has great insight into what the Bible has to say about prophecy, and how it ties into the events of our time. Also, I have put together a "[One Day Prophecy Conference](#)".
